



Green Purchasing Policy

Purpose: Chewton Primary School is committed to sustainable practices within its community. It will endeavour to purchase 'green products' in order to reduce its environmental impact.

Aim:

- Encourage the sustainable use of resources
- Reduce our schools impact on the environment (ecological footprint)
- Eliminate unnecessary purchasing
- Reduce waste to landfill
- Support sustainable long-term markets for recyclable materials
- With all factors being equal in the purchase of a product, choosing the product with the least environmental and/or social impact

Implementation:

When feasible, Chewton Primary School will:

- Purchase paper for printers, photocopies and bathrooms with at least 50 per cent recycled content and progressively move to a higher content
- Considering the alternatives to purchasing a replacement product, such as reusing, refurbishing or reconditioning the existing product or its components to extend its life
- Considering the emissions, pollutants, energy and water required at all stages of the life cycle of the product
- Verify the social responsibility and ethical behaviour of manufacturers and suppliers of the product
- Print material on a double sided setting
- Limit the amount of advertising materials sent home to students
- Consider the purchase of recycled products for book orders and other school supplies
- Consider the environmental impact of cleaning products including those used by contractors
- Promote the use of organic principals in our fruit and vegetable gardens
- Chemical control of weeds will be strictly controlled using Glyphosate application by knapsack sprays.
